I. Background:

A. New Testament Survey

B. Paul's ministry at Ephesus

- 1. Acts 18:18-21 Paul's first journey to Ephesus.
 This is at the end of his second missionary trip.
- Acts 19:1-7 Paul's second journey to Ephesus This results in their receiving the Baptism of the Spirit.
- Acts 19:8-20 Paul stays in Ephesus and teaches for 2 years.
 Extraordinary miracles of healing and deliverance take place by the hands of Paul.
- 4. Acts 19:23-20:1 Many people are set free from witchcraft and magic, burning their books in renouncing Satan and following Christ. A man by the name of Demetrius organized a riotous protest against Paul and the Christians, for their business was being destroyed. They saw themselves as guardians and protectors of Artemis (Acts 19:35).
- 5. Acts 20:17-38 Paul's last visit to Ephesus before his prison ministry. Paul gives his farewell message to these elders.

II. Study on Ephesians 1:1-2

From the Outline:

Eph 1:1-2 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, to the saints who are at Ephesus and who are faithful in Christ Jesus: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

- A. Authorship = Paul
- B. Paul' credentials
 - 1. He is an apostle of Jesus Christ.
 - a. Apostle = (apo = from; stello = to send) lit. one who is sent forth.
 - b. Paul calls himself an apostle in the following books:Rom1:1; 1 Cor 1:1; Gal 1:1; Col 1:1; 1 Thes 2:6; 1 Tim 1:1; 2 Tim 1:1; Titus 1:1
 - c. Eph 2:20 the church is built on foundations of apostles
 - d. Eph 3:5 God reveals mystery of Christ to the apostles
 - e. Eph 4:11 apostles are a ministry that builds the church
 - f. 1 Cor 12:28 apostles are appointed by God in church
 - g. Luke 6:13 Jesus choose 12 disciples to be His apostles
 - h. Acts 1:24-26 the place of Judas' apostleship is filled

C. Written to:

1. The saints at Ephesus

Definition: "Saint" means "a holy person, someone set apart to the Lord."

It is from the NT Greek noun "HAGIOS;" which means, a person, place or thing that is set apart to the Lord.

"HAGIOS" is used 15 times in Ephesians (see Expanded Note # 3).

My thoughts:

- a. It is written to the reader YOU!
- b. All believers are saints.
 (see Ac 9:13, 32, 41, 26:10; Rom 12:13; 15:25, 26, 31; 16:15; 1 Cor 6:1; 14:33; 2 Cor 1:1)
- c. Our call is to live holy(saintly) in Christ (see Rom 1:7; 1 Cor 1:2).
- d. Saints (YOU) are God's household Eph 2:19 So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints, and are of God's household,
- e. All ministers (leaders) Job Description should read "to equip saints" Eph 4:12.
- f. We are qualified as saints because we are in Jesus (see Phil 1:1; Col 1:2).
- g. Salvation is given to the saints (Jude 3).
- 2. Those that are faithful (also see Expanded Note # 4).

The Greek word is pistos, it is used 66 times in the Greek NT; 33 times Paul uses this word.

Definition:

- ✓ Thayer's Greek Lexicon
 - 1. trusty, faithful; used of persons who show themselves faithful in the transaction of business, the execution of commands, or the discharge of official duties: Mt 24:45
 - 2. easily persuaded; believing, confiding, trusting Gal 3:9
- ✓ Vine's Expository Dictionary of Biblical Words
 - 1. In the active sense means "believing, trusting"
 - 2. In the passive sense, "trusty, faithful, trustworthy."

Commentaries:

- ✓ Wycliffe Bible Commentary
 1. The faithful. Believing ones (cf. Gal 3:9).
 - 2. The absence of the article before the word faithful in the original indicates that the saints are the believers.
- ✓ Adam Clarke's Commentary; The Greek word pistos is used for the believer: who has received Christ as the promised Messiah, and the Savior of the world; and continued in the grace which they have received.
- 3. Those who are "in Christ."

We are saints and faithful only because we are in Christ.

Eph 2:8-9 For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, that no one should boast. (see Eph 2:5; Ro 11:6)

D. Those that hear and/or read this letter are to: Receive grace and peace;

From both God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ.

Expanded Notes of Eph 1:1-2

Note #1

New Testament Survey (This section is from Kevin Conners and Ken Malmin's excellent book "New Testament Survey." Their 10 point outline (of each NT Book) is to help the student see and understand the main.)

Introduction (to New Testament Survey)

It is of the utmost importance that the Bible student obtains a good grasp of the Bible as a whole. However, in order to do so he must first gain an understanding of each book that makes up The Book. This text has been designed to be of help in the process of understanding the parts in relating them to the whole.

The format of this study is quite simple. It is designed to give a patterned glimpse of each book of the New Testament.

This has been done by applying these 10 points to each book:

(1) Titles	(6) Purpose
(2) Author	(7) Message
(3) Date	(8) Outline
(4) Key Words and Phrases	(9) Summary
(5) Key Verses	(10) Christ Seen

The following is an explanation of each of the ten parts.

1. Titles:

Under this heading you will find basically three things: First, the meaning of the title of the book is given (e.g. Matthew means "gift of God"). Next, alternate titles are listed when significant. Last, a distinct title has been suggested for each book. This title is meant to both describe the content of the book and to distinguish it from the other books of the Bible (eg. Matthew is called The Book of the King because it presents Jesus as the Kingly Messiah and deals with the things pertaining to the Kingdom of heaven, a key word).

2. Author:

Under this heading is listed the author of the book. In cases where the book does not name its author, the most probable author from our point of view has been given. You will also find a brief point or two distinguishing the author and pointing out any other books written by him

3. Date:

Under this heading you find under the historical books first a reference to the number of years that pass during the accounts given in the book. Then for every book an approximate date has been given as to when the book was written. Also on the Pauline Epistles information has been given to relate those epistles to the book of Acts. (There are many differences of opinion concerning the dates when the New Testament books were written. Thus, the dates listed in this text are conservative estimates.)

4. Keywords and phrases:

Under this heading you will find words and phrases that are keys to understand the book at hand. These have been chosen on the basis of frequency of usage in relation to usage and other books of the Bible. These tabulations are based upon the King James Version unless otherwise noted. These words can be used for good word/theme studies in their respective books.

5. Key Verses:

Under this heading you will find verses that express the main subject, theme, or message of the book.

6. Purpose:

Under this heading you will find the statements that answer the question, "why was his book written?'. These lend insight into the importance of each book. It must be considered that there are many different types of reasons why a book is written (e.g. for historical, instructional, prophetical, etc. reasons). Those thoughts most important have been included.

7. Message:

Under this heading you will find, with some exceptions, the statements of principal that are taught by each book as a whole or at least by a major portion of it. Of these sorts of statements there could be no end but once again only those felt most significant have been included.

8. Outline:

Under this heading you will find a brief, condensed outline of each book showing its structure and arrangement.

9. Summary:

Under this heading you find a paragraph description of the book, pointing out its subject and it's relation to other books of the Bible, as well as other facts of interest concerning the book or its author.

10. Christ Seen:

Under this heading you'll find a brief description of some ways in which Christ can be seen in the book, sometimes accompanied by Scripture references supporting them.

Eph 1:22 And He put all things in subjection under His feet, and gave Him as head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all.

Eph 2:6 and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus,

6. PURPOSE:

- B. The church is a time manifestation of God's eternal purpose in Christ.

- 9. SUMMARY:

During Paul's third missionary journey he spent at least three years at Ephesus establishing the church. It soon became the center for the evangelization of Asia Minor. Then while imprisoned at Rome, Paul wrote this epistle. In chapter 1 he sets forth the eternal purpose of God in Christ and shows the heavenly calling and position of the church. Chapter 3 unfolds the mystery of Christ and the church. Chapter 4 - deals with the unity of the members of the body; chapter 5 - deals with the unity of the body with Christ under the figure of marriage. Then in chapter 6 Paul outlines the church's spiritual warfare. If the church had heeded Paul's admonition to walk in love they would not have received the rebuke of Christ found in Rev 2:1-7.

10. CHRIST SEEN:

Christ is seen as the Fullness of God, the Head of the Church, the Bridegroom, the Giver of Ministries, the Grace of God, and our Peace.

Eph 1:1 This Epistle is written to the saints

Eph 1:4 relationship with Jesus leads to a holy (separated) life, lived for Jesus.

just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be <u>holy</u> and blameless before Him.

Eph 1:13 the Spirit of God is called the Holy Spirit.

In Him, you also, after listening to the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation-- having also believed, you were sealed in Him with the <u>Holy</u> Spirit of promise,
